that do not fit in your bin and are left outside are not permitted and will NOT be picked up by your trash hauler as part of your regular collection. Leaving big, bulky unwanted items outside is prohibited by your property manager.

Items that are more than 50% metal, such as washers, dryers, microwaves, dishwashers, and toasters, can be recycled as scrap metal.
