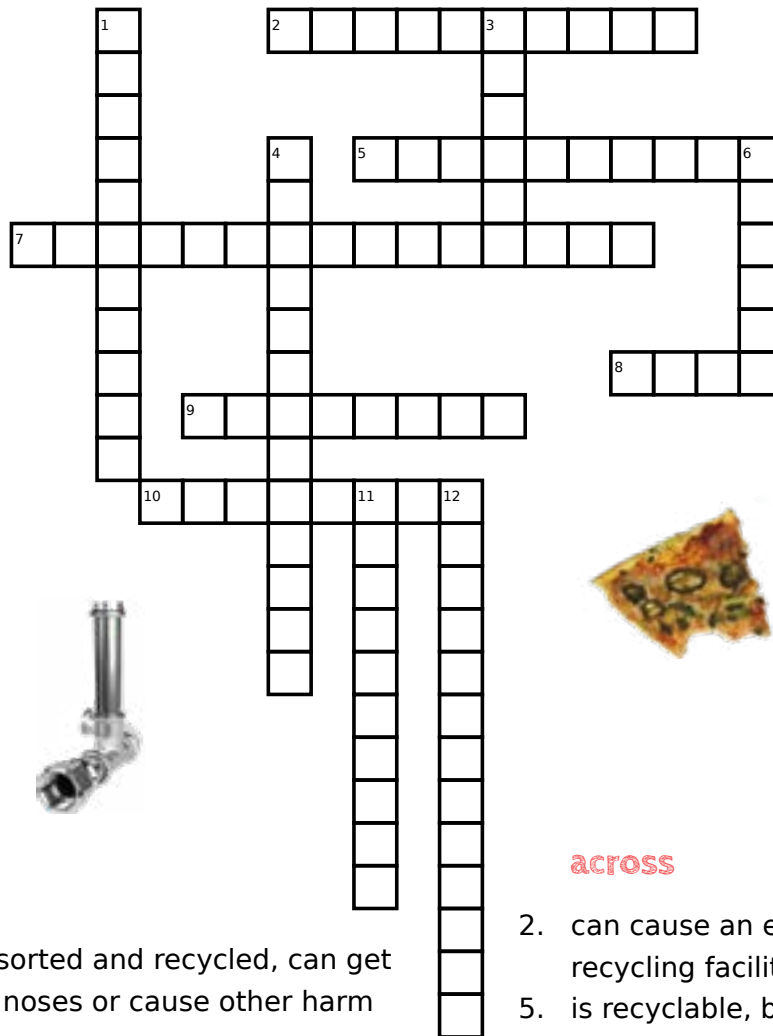
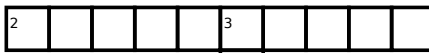


What NOT to Recycle

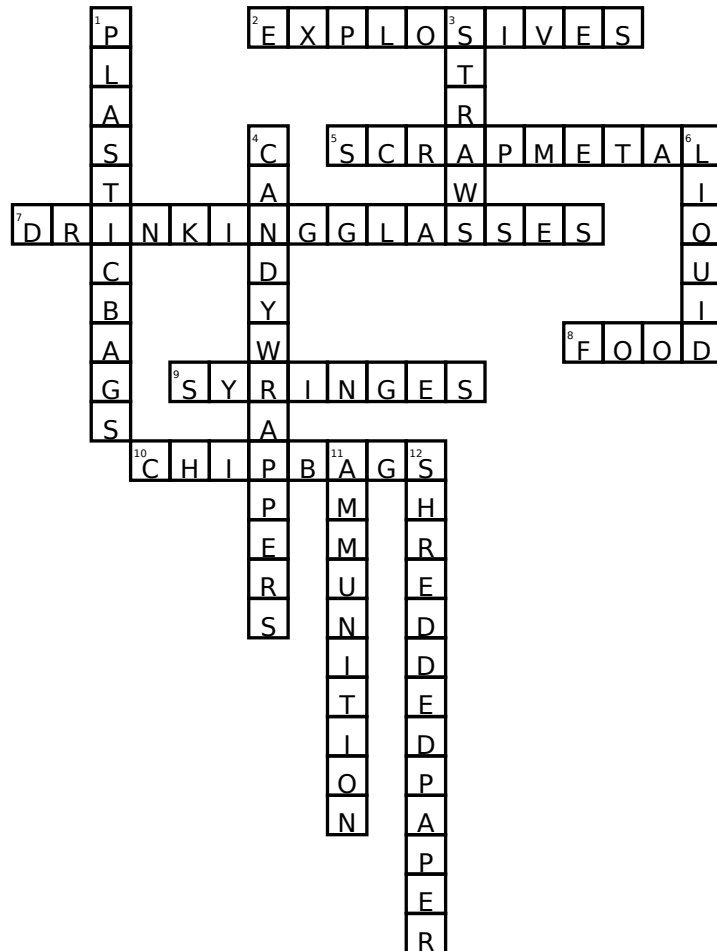
